1 -container of vanilla frosting 1 -dozen eggs

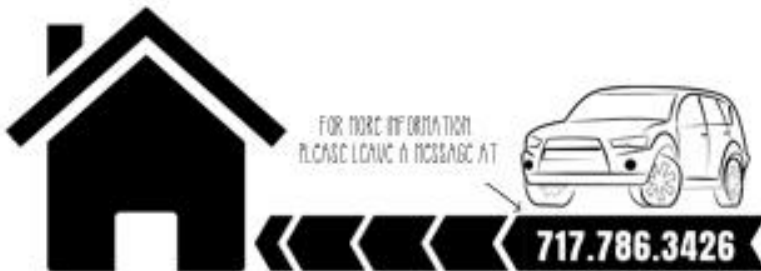
1 -1 lb box of butter or margarine 1 - bag of jelly beans
